
The church we are ministering to in Anchorage is seeing God do wonderful things. We have earnestly been praying to be able to reach new families. Since the relaxing of the COVID restrictions, God is bringing new people into the services. We still have a number who have not returned. Pray that they overcome their fears.

We are moving ahead with preparation for Camp Agaiutim Nune 2022, the remote camp in western Alaska. A full roster of camp workers is in place except for *our second cook*. The Camp needs a second cook. If you or someone you know has experience in cooking for large groups (serving meals for approximately 125 three times per day), please have them contact me as soon as possible (907-223-3660) or email me at [jimschulzalaska@gmail.com](mailto:jimschulzalaska@gmail.com). Kitchen support staff will assist cooks as needed.

The children and young people from surrounding villages are excited that the camp is a "go" again. Please be in prayer with us that God keeps the ability to travel open this summer. We have work teams scheduled to go in early with us. They will be providing maintenance to get things set up after two years of not being able to be present. Preparing for a remote camp is vastly different from being able to drive to a store and purchase an item. Already we are securing items of groceries, maintenance supplies, and repairs. We will also be "logging" for trees to mill with our sawmill in preparation for the building of our first permanent dorm structure in 2023. This "logging" is not conventional logging as there are no trees on the tundra where the camp is located. With the Spring breakup of the 1,982-mile-long Yukon River, trees fall in and make their way down river. Our team goes "logging" to catch them, build a large raft and float them to the camp. The camp's small sawmill (pictured left) will mill them into useable lumber for building.

Another GREAT concern is the price of fuel. We are not sure what we will be paying for fuel in a remote area—it is always much more than urban areas. However, we are confident that God will provide.
